Annual Meeting: Valley Village growth, changes, celebration

Fellowship and tasty food were (as usual) in abundance for the 66 who attended our annual potluck and meeting, Sept. 26 in VMRC's Detwiler Auditorium.

Membership, board president Keith Gnagey announced, has grown by 44 percent in the past year (thanks in part to changes in boundaries), with currently 97 individuals comprising 56 households. Annual fees remain \$60/individual; \$120/household.

Guest speaker Betsy Hay, VMRC's Vice President of Wellness and Community Based Services, announced that "Our vision is to be a destination hub for people who want to age well." She invites us to take part in activities including membership in the wellness center (which includes a pool), lunching in the café, attending lectures and receiving the newsletter.

Many purchased copies of the book, On the Brink of Everything: Grace, Gravity and Getting Old, by Parker J. Palmer (also available for purchase from www.bk-life.com), which will be the subject of a discussion led by Shirley Showalter in February 2020.

Paul Yoder reminded attendees of our volunteer services. There are more volunteers available now than persons requesting services. He encourages VV members to ask for help when wanted, adding, "No computer is needed." Transportation has been the service most in demand. Please see Paul's article below.

Pearl Lantz introduced "Daily Check-in," a new volunteer service for those who wish to be paired with another VV member for checking in on each other daily. Sign up

- Sign up below to be paired with another VV member
- Within a week, you will be contacted regarding a daily check-in partner

Procedure

- Contact each other sometime between 9am-12noon each day
- If you have not heard from your partner by 12noon, try calling them several times; if you have not reached them by 2pm, call one of their emergency contacts and have them follow up with your check-in partner

To opt out

- Call Daily Check-In Coordinator and ask to be taken out of system
- Coordinator will pair another person with your partner for a daily check-in
