Valley Village Board Report

The Valley Village Board met in January to launch the New Year. The board reviewed and approved the January 31, 2019 year-end financial statement. Also Daryl Peifer, treasurer, presented a proposed 2020 budget. The board made some revisions and planned to take action at the February meeting. We thanked Daryl for his exceptional work on Valley Village finances.

As Valley Village continues to develop, we have events on the calendar every month of the year. As a result, the board discussed moving the event cycle to a calendar year (ex., "January-December, 2020") rather than the academic year ("September-June"). This change impacts the event workgroups, so they are providing input for board consideration in February. If implemented, our fiscal year and program year would be the same, January-December.

The Village-To-Village Network annual conference will take place in Charlotte, North Carolina on October 4-7, 2020.


Valley Village Upcoming Events

Movies



(Note: The Movie Committee apologizes for having been unable to show "Miracle on 34th Street" due to a scheduling mix-up. Look for it in December 2020.)


Feb. 21, "Seabiscuit"
